The Learning Commons

The Learning Commons building, otherwise known as the library, has been named in honor of Dr. Ian Fair & June Fair. They were instrumental in helping several HCU faculty attain Masters degrees, assisting with degree program curriculum for Theology, and consulting on the development of HCU in its formative years.

This building has 4 floors. The basement and two other floors are open space for students to study, work in groups and relax. One floor is occupied by shelves with books. Although paper books are not generally our desire, we are required to have a minimum supply of paper books by the accreditation entity. They have not embraced e-books yet. In time we hope to shift from this requirement.



The CEPE Building

The CEPE Building was named in honor of the Deon & Susan Fair family who have sponsored the development of the Entrepreneurial efforts at HCU.

This building houses the CEPE and temporarily the School of Law which will soon begin to accept students.



McVey Building

The McVey Building has been named in honor of Dan McVay and Brenda McVey who served for over 2 decades as missionaries to Ghana. They ran the HBI School prior to the current team at HBI. Many of the faculty came to Christ through their efforts.

The top floor holds the Nursing Skills lab. The other floors have been refurbished into office space.
